Calvin Coolidge Presidential Foundation Scholarship

Applicants must intend to enroll full-time at an accredited US college/university as an undergraduate student in the fall of 2024. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents of the U.S. The Coolidge Scholarship is an annually awarded, full-ride presidential scholarship that covers a student's tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. Coolidge scholars must possess a distinguished academic record. Competitive candidates will have pursued and succeeded in the most rigorous course of study available to them. The Primary Criterion for the Coolidge scholarship is ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE. Application deadline is February 23.

The TOP 175 Scholarships for College Students

Western Legacy Foundation Scholarship

Applicants for this scholarship must be a high school senior from South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana, Wyoming or Nebraska. The application must include an essay of 500 words or more about "Advancing My Western Heritage Through Continuing Education and Career". Packet must also include specified personal information (found on the application), a letter of acceptance for the post-secondary school you plan to attend, a letter of recommendation from a school administrator/staff, high school transcript, and current color portrait of the applicant.

There are 16 scholarships awarded annually which are separated into 5 categories. The categories and requirements are listed on the application. The deadline for applications is December 18, 2022. Applications MUST be emailed or postmarked NO LATER than December 18, 2022. To apply visit WesternLegacyFoundation.com or stop in the counselors' office to pick up an application and scholarship details.

South Dakota USA Scholarship:

Participants must have participated in the USA Softball of South Dakota sanctioned programs for at least 3 years as a player, coach, umpire, USA Softball of SD official, or in an official capacity of a USA Softball of SD sanctioned team or league. You must be a graduating senior and planning to attend an accredited post-secondary institute. With the application, candidates must include a 400-word personal statement describing your personal, education and career goals, including data relating to financial need. You will also need 2 letters of recommendation. Applications are available in the Counselors' Office

South Dakota Solid Waste Management **Association (SDSWMA)**

An applicant should desire a career in a trade supportive to the protection and enhancement of our natural resources and environment, the solid waste industry and/or related fields. Applicants must intend to enroll for the fall semester. Preference will be given to SD residents enrolling at a SD institute. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.0. To apply, you must submit an application letter postmarked no later than January 15. 4 Secrets to Winning Scholarships

- Set monthly scholarship application goals
 - apply for these scholarships LIKE IT'S YOUR
 JOB!
 - This requires self-motivation, consistency, and discipline.
- Apply for Scholarships that require an essay.
 - Many students avoid college scholarship applications that require essays, so you will have less competition.
- Do NOT overlook the \$500 scholarships.
 - Students are drawn to the big scholarships.
 Meaning fewer students are applying for the \$500 scholarships; your odds of winning these are higher.
- Find scholarships that fit YOUR interests.
 - Scholarship judges notice when an applicant is passionate about a topic/cause.
 - If your interests/goals match the scholarship, your background, experience and passion tend to support the scholarship for which you are applying.

Ways to Pay for College

Full-ride scholarships are hard to find and harder to win. It's estimated that about 1% of students applying to college receive a full ride. You will need to get creative when it comes to paying for college. That means, you may need to utilize one, some or multiple of the following:

- Scholarships and Grants-FREE money! These never have to be paid back. Put your efforts into applying for these early and often.
- Financial Aid-this is distributed by the Federal Government as well as universities. This requires you to complete the FAFSA.
 - *Information on this process has been provided in several of the last newsletters.
- Private Student Loans-this may be used to help cover the "gap" between what a college costs and what a student can afford to pay after merit and financial aid packages have been distributed. Use Fastweb's <u>Student Loan Finder</u>
- College Savings-It's never too late to start saving for college. ex-529 College Savings Plans
- Part-time Jobs & Internships-many students
 use earnings from part-time jobs and
 internships to help subsidize student expenses.
 Many employers offer employer tuition
 assistance, or tuition reimbursement.
- <u>Education Tax Benefits</u>-students are eligible for Education Tax Benefits each year that they are enrolled in college.
 - Lifetime Learning Tax Credit: up to \$2,000/year can be claimed for being enrolled in any continuing education courses or programs.
 - American Opportunity Tax Credit: up to \$2,500 can be claimed for up to four years by students seeking a degree, certification or other recognized credential.

Athletic Participation Post-High School
Some students desire to compete athletically at
the next level. Is that you? If so, there are a
couple things you should know.

You can compete at a college/university that is either <u>NCAA (DI, DIII, DIII)</u> or <u>NAIA</u> affiliated. Both have different requirements and guidelines.

- NCAA- you need to create an account with the NCAA Eligibility Center
 - NCAA Guide
- NAIA- you need to register with the NAIA
 Eligibility Center by creating a profile at
 PlayNAIA.org. NAIA requires students to send specific documentation to be eligible to compete.

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How Much Will College Cost?

Great question!

Every school's tuition/fees/expenses will be slightly different.

Do your research! Go to the University/College website and search "TUITION".

Most tuition information is going to be presented as "per semester", and remember that it will be based on how many credits you take.

Get your calculator out and start doing the math!
A full-time student will need to take AND PASS 12 credit hours. To receive all of your Federal Financial Aid (this amount will be on your Award Letter), you must enroll (and pass) as a full-time student. [You may receive partial amounts of aid as a part-time student which is 6 credit hours per semester.]

Now. Let's do some Math!

EXAMPLE:

- Tuition-\$250 (per credit)
- Fees:
 - Activity fee- \$40 (per credit)
 - Special Discipline Fee (undergraduate: per credit) \$30
- Automobile Registration-\$100 (for the year)
- Books/supplies \$400 \$600 (per semester)
 Using 12 credit hours:

(12 x 250)+(12 X 40)+(12 X 30)+100+ 400 = Fall semester Bill

*This doesn't include residence hall, food plan or any other fees and costs associated with each specific school. And we only based it off of 12 credit hours-the bare minimum to be a full-time student.

Do your research! Math doesn't lie. It will give you a good understanding of what your financial obligation will be. Don't be shocked! Ignorance isn't always bliss!
