Fred and Marie Christopherson Scholarship- \$1,750

Applicants who plan to attend a four-year college/university in South Dakota, have a minimum GPA of 3.9 and have a minimum ACT score of 28 are eligible for this award. Apply through SF Area Community Foundation.

Justin Lake College Scholarship - \$1,000 Awarded to graduating high school seniors from Tea Area HS and Huron HS or James Valley Christian HS. An additional award is available to graduating seniors who attend any SD high school. Applicants must plan to attend an accredited college/university or vocational/technical school and must demonstrate financial need. Apply through the SF Area Community Foundation Website.

<u>Kimberly Rose Means-Native American Council of</u> Tribes Scholarship-\$950

Awarded to graduating high school seniors who are enrolled members of a SD Native American tribe. Applicants must plan to attend an accredited college/university or technical school; have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher; have participated in school and community activities; and have the desire and ability to accomplish his/her goals. Apply through the SF Area Community Foundation

Deadline: March 15

South Dakota Fire Service Scholarship

- 1. A Son or daughter of any member (living, deceased or retired) of a fire department in South Dakota or an active member of a junior fire department in South Dakota.
- 2. The applicant must be sponsored by a fire department that has 100% membership in the SD Firefighters Association for the current year.
- 3. The applicant may also be sponsored by a member of the SD Firefighters Auxiliary, a local fire department auxiliary or a member of the Dear Old Timers.
- 4. The scholarship may be used at any college or Post-Secondary institution (Vo-Tech). Preference will be given to those who are obtaining a fire or emergency service degree.
- 5. Applications must be received or postmarked by March 15th.

college/university or a technical school; have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher; minimum ACT of 21; and demonstrate characteristics of an American patriot. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need.

Norman W. Ranschau Memorial Scholarship-\$3,750

Applicants for this scholarship must be students who plan to pursue a degree in an agricultural-related field and who attend school or reside in specified counties or the state of South Dakota. Applicants must be first-time students with financial need who have participated in agricultural extracurricular activities. Apply through the SF Area Community

Osmann Family Native American Scholarship-\$1,250 Awarded to graduating SD high school seniors who are enrolled members of a Native American tribe. Applicants must plan to attend a SD university or vocational school and have a GPA of 2.5 or higher. Applicants must also have the desire and ability to succeed in further academic study and have participated in extra-curricular or community activities. Scott Lippincott Memorial Scholarship

Deadline: March 15

- Complete your FAFSA online at StudentAid.gov
- Watch for the email notice indicating your FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) is ready.
- Review your FSS for errors and make any corrections as indicated.
- Finish admissions applications.
- Research and apply for other financial aid, including grants and scholarships.
- Watch for early admissions notices.
- Research deadlines at the college you plan to attend, such as for housing applications, schoolspecific financial aid applications and deadlines.
- Organize scholarships, certificates, articles, etc. to illustrate your achievements and create a portfolio to display them.

8 Things to Know About the New FAFSA

- 1.The 2024-2025 FAFSA opened December 31, 2023
 - The significant changes to the FAFSA have delayed it's release for this year only. In future years, the FAFSA will return to its October 1 opening date.
- 2. The FSA ID is more important than ever.
 - To start the FAFSA, an FSA ID is required. Students and parents MUST have an FSA ID to fill out the form, including parents without a Social Security number.
- 3.The questions are different.
 - Questions are being removed, added, and rearranged.
- 4. The parent included on the FAFSA may change.
 - For dependent students with separated parents, the parent providing the most financial support must be included on the new FAFSA.
- 5. There are significant terminology changes.
 - Someone required to report their information on the FAFSA, typically the student and their parent(s), is called a "contributor". The IRS DRT is being retired and replaced by direct data exchange. The Student Aid Report is now called the FAFSA Submission Summary.
- 6.Consenting to direct data exchange (DDX) is required.
 - Through the DDX process the IRS shares the federal tax information (FTI) with the Department of Education and the colleges listed on the FAFSA to calculate a Student Aid Index. Every contributor on the FAFSA is required to consent to DDX, even if they didn't file taxes, for the student to be eligible for federal financial aid.
- 7.Student Aid Index will replace EFC.
 - After submitting the FAFSA, students will receive a Student Aid Index (SAI) instead of an Expected Family Contribution (EFC). College financial aid offices, state agencies, and the federal government will use the SAI to determine eligibility for financial aid. A student with an SAI of 0 or below (it can be as low as -1,500) will be eligible for a full federal Pell Grant. Due to formula changes, the switch to SAI is expected to increase the number of students eligible for the Pell Grant.
- 8. Financial Aid eligibility could decrease.
 - With the change to SAI, some students may see a decrease in financial aid eligibility. The SAI formula does not account for siblings in college and requires the new worth of all businesses and farms to be reported as assets. Students with either scenarios should speak with their financial aid office to prepare for any reductions to their financial aid.

Your FAFSA Checklist: What You Need to Complete the Form

- Your Social Security Card and Driver's License, and /or alien registration card if you are not a U.S. citizen.
- Your **2022 Federal Income Tax Returns**, W-2's, and **other records of money earned** (<u>Financial Aid Direct Data Exchange</u> can help you transfer your federal tax return information right into your FAFSA form.)
- Your parents' 2022 Federal Income Tax Returns, W-2's and 1040 forms if you are a dependent (AND YOU ARE UNLESS DECLARED OTHERWISE.)
- Records and documentation of other nontaxable income received such as welfare benefits, Social Security income, veteran's benefits, military or clergy allowances (if applicable).
- Any additional applicable financial information, such as taxable work-study, assistantships, fellowships, grants and scholarship aid reported to the IRS, combat pay, or special combat pay and cooperative education program earnings.
- Records of any additional nontaxable income: child support received, veterans' non-education benefits, money received or paid on your behalf.
- Current bank and brokerage account statements, including records of stocks, bonds, mutual funds and other investments.
- Business or investment farm records
- Records relating to any unusual family financial circumstances.
- Title IV institution Codes for each school you are applying to. You can get this code from the school (some have them listed on their websites) or you can use FinAid's TItle IV School Code Database
- FSA ID for you and your parents. This is how you sign the FAFSA. Create a FSA ID online
- *Gather your materials and complete your forms sooner rather than later. Many states award financial aid on a FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE basis. Putting off your financial aid is NOT something you want to do.
- **Once you complete your FAFSA, save copies of your completed form, along with copies of all the information you gathered in order to fill it out.
