Appointment

- The annual period of service will be reflected in the contract.
- The building principal or designee will be the teacher's immediate supervisor.

Qualifications of Speech Language Pathologist

- The SLP will meet certification/licensure requirements as established by the state of South Dakota.

Duties

- The SLP will provide instruction and will assess to verify progress in student learning, following guidelines established by state standards, district curriculum, individual educational plans, and the school district's strategic plan.
- The SLP will be responsible for reports required by the school district and state, maintaining attendance records, and monitor progress of students.
- The SLP will create and maintain a learning environment, which invites and encourages self-discipline, good citizenship, and good study and work habits.
- The SLP will treat all students with respect.
- The SLP will provide for the safety and welfare of students within the school environment.
- The SLP will maintain a professional relationship with all district staff.
- The SLP will share responsibilities assigned outside of the classroom.
- The SLP will support activities, which strengthen school/community relationships.
- The SLP will work respectfully and cooperatively with parents. He/she will report directly to them at parent-teacher conferences as scheduled and as need arise.
- The SLP will responsibly and economically use and care for supplies and equipment.
- The SLP will establish goals to enhance professional growth.
- The SLP will be evaluated in accordance with provisions of the negotiated evaluation policy. The SLP will provide supervision of Speech Language Pathology Assistant's as described by SD Codified Law 36-37-20 and Rule 20:79:04.
