# Parents of Seniors: Here's What You Should Be Doing in March-May to Prepare for College

#### March:

-Look for financial aid letters: Financial aid packages may start arriving this month. If your child does not receive their financial aid award letters yet, contact EACH school.

March is a great time to sit down with your teen and work through the numbers for each school.

-Talk less and listen more: listen to your teen as they agonize over which college to attend. Use this opportunity to share in the decision-making process.

-Push for scholarships: your teen should be kneedeep in scholarship applications. Here's a few tips to help make that process go smoother:

- make sure they have an "activities resume"
- read ALL of the eligibility requirements and directions
- remind them to get letters of recommendation ASAP.
- check over any applications before they hit "submit"

#### **April:**

-Take a road trip-if your teen has been accepted to more than one college and they are still unsure, now is the time to visit each campus.

-Review Pros and Cons

-Compare financial aid awards.

#### May:

-Work together: May is full of decisions!

-Be ready for "Decision Day"-May 1 is known as
National College Decision Day, or the date your
teen needs to notify their school of choice that
they're coming. There are also financial
requirements that need to be fulfilled. Make sure
to review any deposit requirements detailed in
your acceptance letter.

-Notify other schools-have your teen send a brief note to the other colleges to thank them and turn down their offers.

-Request a final transcript from the counseling office-your child needs to submit a request for their final high school transcript to be sent to the college they'll be attending. These will be mailed out after final grades are posted.

- -Get to know the financial aid office-Find out if there is anything else they need from you.
- -Determine if you need additional money to pay for college-if you still need additional aid, consider parent loans or private loans.

And remember, all the emotions you are feeling right now are normal. Amidst this busy time, don't forget to take time as a family. Your soon-to-be college student needs your guidance (and checkbook), but they also just need you to be mom and dad.

# What YOU Should Be Doing in March!

- Check with the financial aid offices to ensure your paperwork is complete. Be on the lookout for acceptance letters.
- Begin to compare the financial aid offers from schools you've been accepted to.
- With your parents, estimate overall costs and how much money you will likely need for living expenses.
- Research Housing options and be prepared to apply and pay a deposit for on-campus housing.
- Start looking for summer jobs.
