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Research has found that highly proficient readers are strategic readers. Further research shows that these five strategies can be used no matter what kind of text is being read and they can be taught. Findings also indicate that when these are explicitly taught and modeled, they transfer from classroom practice to real-world reading.

- Predicting and inferring.
- Self-questioning.
- Monitoring and clarifying.
- Evaluating and determining importance.
- Summarizing and synthesizing.

What can we do to bring these strategies into content areas and to help students who don't think like readers? One effective approach that incorporates all of the strategies is **SQP2RS**, an instructional framework for teachers to follow.

Predict State 1-3 things we'll learn.

Read Read the text.

Respond Try to answer questions. Modify, drop, add.

Summarize At end of text.

Survey

Explore the text before reading.

- 1. Look at pictures and captions.
- 2. Read the highlighted and bold words.
- 3. Read the headings and subheadings.
- 4. Think about what you are about to read.

Question

What questions will we answer?

Generate questions that we will be able to answer after we read.

Predict

What will we learn?

Predict 1 to 3 things we will learn while reading.

Read

Read the text.

Read:

- -Alone
- -With teacher
- -With partner
- -With group

Respond

Which questions were answered?

- 1. Discuss which questions were answered in the text.
- 2. Review which questions were not answered.
- 3. Eliminate questions that are not likely to be answered.
- 4. Develop new questions.
- 5. Continue surveying process.

Summarize

What did we learn?

Summarize what we have learned, orally or in writing.
